### Geography inspection

The government have established a system of subject inspections of schools to compensate for the fact that a full Ofsted inspection does not have the capacity to report on each subject. Schools are chosen randomly for an inspection and we have recently had a subject inspection of **Geography**. **The school was visited by a member of Her Majesty's Inspectorate who graded the work of the department on a four point scale 1-outstanding, 2-good, 3-satisfactory, 4-inadequate and he came to the following conclusions.**

**Achievement and standards - Both achievement and standards are outstanding overall, particularly at KS4 and KS5. Behaviour is very good, reflecting teachers' high expectations.**

**Quality of teaching and learning of geography - Outstanding overall. Teachers' planning is thorough and their subject knowledge is excellent. Lessons are stimulating and engaging. Marking is regular and accurate.**

**Quality of curriculum - Outstanding overall with a strong fieldwork programme, and an excellent interactive website.**

**Leadership and management of geography - Outstanding. The excellent geography team is very well led and managed. Self-evaluation is accurate and the department knows precisely what needs to be done to improve further.**

**Community cohesion - Outstanding. The school has the Eco-Schools Silver Award with the geography department a driving force behind this initiative. It has forged strong and effective links with Waitrose, the Co-Op and a local Fairtrade shop. Students enjoy excellent relationships with teachers and each other. Most students are fully engaged in their learning. They value each other and relationships between learners from different backgrounds are very positive.**

**The overall effectiveness of geography is outstanding. To put this in context the HMI said that he had never given outstanding in all areas to any secondary school department before. This report obviously reflects the high quality of leadership by Mrs Mottram, the effectiveness of her team and the positive attitude of our pupils. My congratulations and thanks to Mrs Mottram, Ms Monk, Mr Moon, Mr Chambers, Mrs Morey, Mr Gray, Mr Scott and Ms Bonin-Casey.**

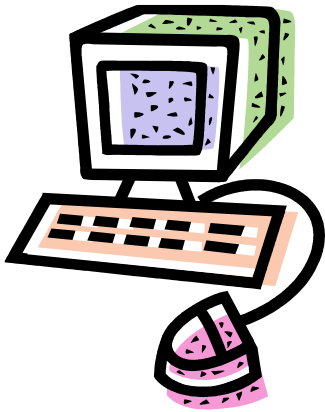
