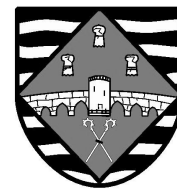

## Travel & Tourism Trip to New York

As part of the new AS/A2 Travel and Tourism course which commenced in September 2005, a group of students from Years 12/13 visited New York for a four day study tour designed to enhance student understanding of the travel and tourism industry.

During their stay the students visited many of New York's most famous tourist attractions, (students were encouraged to assess the nature of the facilities provided and in particular consider aspects of customer service) including Central Park and relevant attractions (e.g. Strawberry Fields - memorial to John Lennon), Rockefeller Centre - Top of the Rock (new attraction providing superb views across the city), Empire State Building, Grand Central Station, Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island (immigration museum). The trip also included a Rolling Seminar, taking in Harlem, and the Upper West and East Side of New York as well as Manhattan. This tour included a thought provoking visit to Ground Zero where students took the opportunity to reflect and pay their respects to those who lost their lives.

One of the highlights of the trip was a visit to New York University. Leila Rach, an eminent figure in New York's Travel and Tourism Industry and the Dean of the Preston Robert Tisch Centre for Hospitality, Tourism and Sports Management, kindly hosted a morning for our students at the Preston Robert Tisch Centre. This was an extremely valuable experience and one from which students gained an awful lot, both in terms of content related to their course and in raising their aspirations for further study / work in the tourism industry.

The trip was a real success and the students we took were a real credit to St Ivo School. We are hoping to run the trip on an annual basis and further strengthen our links with New York University.

It has been a busy half term for the music department. Firstly there was the Summer Concert on the 11th May at which around 150 pupils took part, including 80 Year 7 pupils. ## Drama Department News

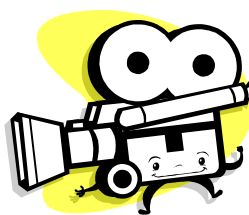

## Catering News



The Year 10 Catering groups have visited The Dolphin Hotel in preparation for their two weeks Work Experience. The students have to do a catering based work experience in order to complete a project which represents 20% of their final grade. The students walked around the kitchens and saw the large scale grills, cookers and mixers. They also spoke to the Head Chef and found out about who worked there and what their job entailed. A trip like this is vital so that they experience a commercial kitchen. Also Ken Smith, Head Chef of Pembroke College in Cambridge, is coming in to speak to the students about his work and the vocational opportunities open to our students.

## Nestle Purina Visit Wisbech

Year 12 food technology students were treated to a very interesting visit, by Nestle, when they were able to see first hand industrial processes. The visit began with the students watching a product panel, where the technologists performed sensory analysis on random samples of pet food produced the previous day. Next there was a very interesting talk on the factory, with reference to management, turn over and production. The tour around the factory floor high lighted manufacturing on a large scale, special attention was made to the pouche packaging where we witnessed 14 pouches per second being made and filled. This method of marketing the product is used increasingly in human food production and many parallels can be drawn between the two industries. Useful learning took place which supports a section of the AS specification. All enjoyed their visit.

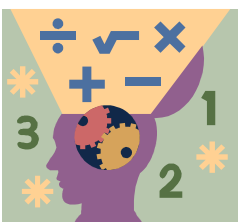
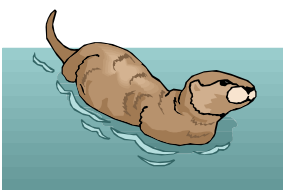

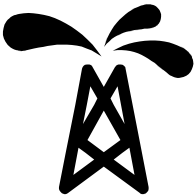
